The B.C. government works in partnership with the Adoptive Families Association of BC to increase the number of children being adopted and to raise awareness about children who are waiting to join loving and secure homes through adoption.

The Adoptive Families Association of BC is a non-profit organization that supports adoptive families and promotes adoption. Since 1977, AFABC has been dedicated to finding a family for every child through adoption awareness, education and support.

DAWSON CREEK RCMP NEWS RELEASE

On the morning of September 2, 2011, Dawson Creek RCMP responded to a Motor Vehicle accident which occurred on the Alaska Highway near the Kiskatinaw Bridge. The accident involved two vehicles. One of the drivers was taken to the Dawson Creek hospital with severe injuries. The driver later succumbed to the injuries sustained. Names to be released at a later date. The incident is currently under investigation by the RCMP. Alcohol is currently not a factor.

On September 3, 2011, shortly after 7:00 pm, members of the RCMP's Peace Region Traffic Services became involved in the pursuit of a black pick-up truck that had been speeding in excess of 160 km/h on No. 97 Highway, North of Dawson Creek.

As the suspect vehicle neared the City of Dawson Creek, Detachment members initiated a series of roadblocks intended to prevent the pursuit from entering busy streets. The 19 year old male driver abandoned the truck in the parking lot of the Ramada Inn and fled on foot with his 16 year old female passenger. Both were arrested shortly afterward, after being brought to police attention by bystanders.

The driver will appear for a bail hearing before a Justice of Peace on September 4, 2011. He is charged with a variety of offences which include dangerous driving, driving while disqualified, flight from police, assault with a weapon, and drug possession.

MAYOR'S REPORT

September 9, 2011

One duty that a Mayor normally fills (although, it could be a Councillor), is that of a Director in the Regional District, and in our case, the Peace River Regional District (PRRD). Since becoming Mayor, I have done just that, with Councillors filling in when I cannot attend. During this time, both Regional Districts and the Province have looked to see if there are better ways to structure and operate Regional Districts, as the current system is awkward and does not necessarily meet the governance objectives of both municipalities and unincorporated areas.

A few years ago the Northern Rockies Regional District and the Town of Fort Nelson reorganized and with Provincial help, re-incorporated as a "Regional Municipality". Essentially, this means that the entire area of the former Regional District now operates as one government. Since then, various Provincial Ministers have asked if the PRRD is interested in this same type of change, but it has not gained any local traction.

Although I have not formally asked for Council's or the PRRD's opinion or support for this, I do believe that this concept does have merit. Not maybe as one large Regional Municipality as the City of Fort St. John once proposed (and was met with a resounding "NO"), but as three smaller ones, such as a North Peace (Fort St. John/Taylor and north), South Peace (Dawson Creek/Pouce Coupe and south) and West Peace (Hudson's Hope/Chetwynd/Tumbler Ridge and mountain areas).

Unfortunately, as I end my term as Mayor of Chetwynd and a Director of the PRRD, I will not be around to advance this concept, at least not very far. (That will have to be left to others, if they so choose.) But, what I will do, is introduce this concept at our next Peace River Local Government Association meeting on September 14th in Taylor, just in time to see if it is a topic that could become the subject of our upcoming local government elections (it is easy for me to do this, as I am not running and don't have to answer the questions!!)

All jests aside, I do believe that the concept has merit and should warrant a serious look. The number of issues we all deal with by having two separate forms of government for side by side communities, such as the conflicts that occur between unincorporated communities and the adjacent incorporated areas for the delivery of services, or the belief that rural areas don't care about what happens within incorporated areas and vice versa, to the cost of services and the duplicity that we all face, should be looked at. And, for our western PRRD communities, it could make even more sense, when it comes to more efficient management of our small communities and the recruitment of staff.

I am not sure where this will go, but do know that there will be plenty of opposition, as one can always expect opposition with the mere thought of change. Debate is warranted and will be appreciated, as that is how we will figure out if this is positive for all of us, or not. If you have any questions on this, or any other topic, please let me know. 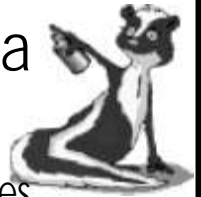

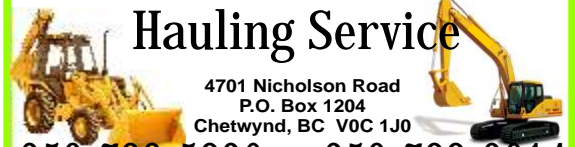

**AIR QUALITY BOOSTED BY
WOOD STOVE EXCHANGE FUNDING**

Wood stove exchange programs in communities throughout B.C. will share another \$200,000 in funding to help more people swap old wood stoves for new high-efficiency models, Environment Minister Terry Lake announced.

The Province is providing \$200,000 to the BC Lung Association to expand and continue the successful wood stove exchange program. Local governments, non-profit organizations and airshed or air quality management organizations interested in starting or extending a wood stove exchange program are invited to apply by Oct. 14 for programs beginning January 2012.

New high-efficiency wood stoves are proven to burn one-third less wood, reduce emissions by up to 70 per cent and significantly reduce risks of chimney fires. But there are still about 120,000 old, inefficient wood stoves in use around B.C. These units can affect the health of homeowners, their neighbours and overall airshed health.

Provincial funding allows participating communities to provide a \$250 rebate on the purchase of a new wood stove, insert or pellet stove. Many local governments provide additional rebates and waive permit fees.

Dealers, manufacturers and suppliers may also offer additional discounts to encourage people to upgrade their woodstoves. Further rebates are available through:

Wood smoke contains tiny particles called particulate matter (PM). Particulate matter that is 2.5 microns or less in diameter, called PM2.5, is small enough to be breathed into the deepest parts of the lungs. It is associated with all sorts of health problems, from a runny nose and coughing, to bronchitis, asthma, emphysema, pneumonia, heart disease and even premature death.

Since the launch in 2008, B.C. has invested close to \$1.9 million for rebates, education and support to 25 programs across B.C., ranging in size from district municipalities through to regional programs involving several regional districts. Over 4,100 old stoves have been changed out or are expected to be changed out by the end of the year, preventing an estimated 582 tonnes of PM2.5 from being released into the atmosphere since 2008.

Quote: Minister of Environment Terry Lake - "Older wood stoves can be a significant source of air pollution in many B.C. communities. By switching to a new, high-efficiency wood stove, people can help improve air quality in their community and save money on their heating costs by burning less wood to get the same heat."

Quick Facts: Following good burning techniques is just as important as using a high- efficiency model of wood stove. A few simple tips can significantly reduce emissions from wood stoves - and as a bonus, homeowners will need to burn less wood to heat their home.

* Dry, seasoned wood burns best. Firewood should be seasoned by splitting and stacking it in the spring. Woodpiles should be protected from rain and snow, but still have good air circulation.

* Burn only clean, dry wood. Never burn green, wet, painted or treated wood - including plywood. Never burn household garbage.

* Create small, bright fires by using small pieces of kindling to start the fire and keep it moderately hot, adding larger pieces of split wood as required. Do not damper down the fire more than necessary because that produces more smoke.

* Watch for signs of incomplete burning, such as visible smoke coming from the chimney or long, lazy flames in the firebox. Opening the dampers will allow more air into the stove and improve the fire's efficiency.

* Where possible, avoid burning on poor air quality days.

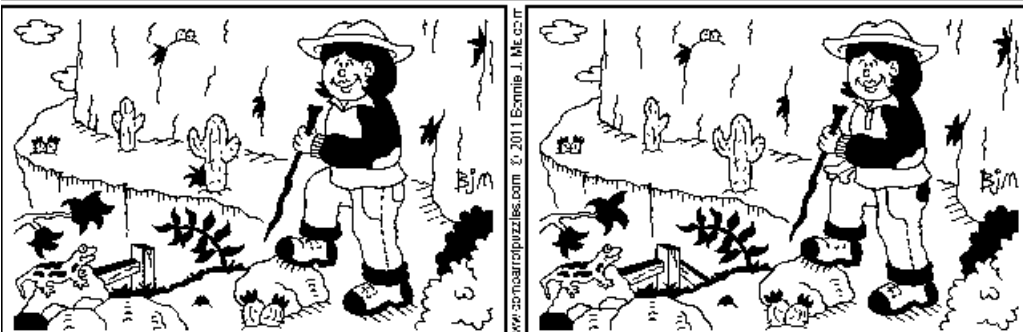
